



# NATURAL GAS CONNECTION CHECK LIST

There are lots of things to consider when you're deciding to build a new house, but having a clear idea on the appliances and features you'd like included will help you land on your dream home.

Our checklist will guide you through the process of getting gas connected in your new build - and tell you when and what to ask.



## At the land estate

### Ask if your land estate is natural gas ready

When you're making the decision on where to buy your house and land package, ask if the area will be connected to the natural gas network. It's best to do this when you're talking to the land sales office or viewing display homes.



## At the builder display home

### Ask which natural gas appliances are included in the build

While viewing display homes, ask which natural gas appliances are being offered in the build. If the plan doesn't include something you want - for example a hot water system, cooktop, oven, outdoor barbecue or heater - now's the time to request to add these to your house and land package.



## Documentation and design

### Confirm required natural gas connections are included

After committing to build, you'll be provided with a range of documents outlining the features of your home. Make sure that all the natural gas appliances or connections you've requested are included; once you sign on the dotted line, it's hard to make changes to the building plans.



## The builder pre-start

### Select your appliances

The deal is signed and sealed, so now comes the best bit - choosing the appliances you want in your new home - while your builder does the hard work.
